Funding will establish a grant program in Calvert County, enabling local providers and community-based organizations to implement new or expand existing services and supports. Funding priorities will be determined by a community survey conducted with the assistance of the Calvert County Government.

An Overdose Prevention Team will be formed to oversee this initiative. Chaired by the Health Department, with a co-chair from a local partner organization, this multidisciplinary team will include representatives from local agencies, providers, and community groups. Designees from each participating member/agency will be identified to review and evaluate all grant applications, ensuring compliance with all state and local requirements and criteria.

From 2017 to 2021, opioid-related deaths in Calvert County accounted for 1.00 percent of total opioid related deaths in the State. This represented a decrease of 37 percent from 2017 to 2021. We believe this outcome can best be attributed to the collaborative approach local agencies have adopted to address both treatment and prevention. Despite this decrease, more work remains to support and expand current programs, as well as encourage new initiatives, to maintain and improve upon the progress made.

2. A multidisciplinary pool of designees from each represented entity on the OPT will be created to evaluate all applications received for funding.
3. The OPT will have a public announcement for applications for this funding based on the criteria of the state funds.
4. The OPT will survey the community to determine priorities for funding with the assistance of Calvert County Government.
5. A minimum of three (3) eligible agencies will be supported with this funding to support an increase and expansion of services throughout the county.
